Tracey and Shelley attended their first Magna conference in Aurora 6 years ago where they learned about the Magna Match program. This program allows employees to double donations they raise for charities, not-for-profits, or employees in need by having them matched by Magna! This sparked interest for Tracey and Shelley, and they brought their ideas back to Autosystems with the goal of making a difference in their community.

At the start of each year, Tracey and Shelley plan which community organizations they will support each month. Many employees have been inspired by the program and offer suggestions for local initiatives.
